June 5th

Jews and Art History: Adaptation, Innovation, and Exploitation



This lecture will look into the canon of European Art from the Middle Ages until today. We will track how Jews transitioned from props to patrons, to progressive artists in their own right.

June 12th

The Torah in Time: Antiquity



This lecture will study how Jewish sacred texts were influenced by their surroundings in Antiquity. We will see what each text tells us about the era in which it was made and the development of Judaism at that time.

This lecture will continue our study of how Jewish sacred texts were influenced by their surroundings in the Middle Ages and Early Modernity
